The registered charity has helped more than 1,500 mothers and babies through its services, which include arranging for mothers to return to their homeland with their children or securing Hong Kong residency, birth certificates, medical treatment and counseling services for migrant families.

Tim Murphy, CEO of IP Global, explained that the charity golf event was both a fun and united effort to carry out the company’s charitable endeavors.
